Conditions.

1. The Licence Holder shall operate the site in accordance with the plan No. 992/1 and details and statements of intent dated 10th February 1991, and 21st June 1991, attached to this Licence. The Licence Holder shall notify the Waste Disposal Authority in writing of any proposed change in the actual conduct of operations from the proposals shown in the plan and details attached to this Licence, as altered by any previously notified changes, at least one month before the proposed change is implemented. No proposed change shall be instigated without the prior written consent of the Waste Disposal Authority.
2. The types of waste accepted at the site, the maximum input rate and the maximum quantity stored at the site shall be as described in the attached schedule 992/A.
3. No poisonous, noxious or polluting waste shall be accepted at the site except as detailed in the attached schedule (992/A). Any such waste shall be dealt with as specified in the details attached to this Licence.
4. The area to which this licence relates shall be as shown edged red on the attached plan No.992/1.
5. Each load received shall be inspected to ensure compliance with Conditions 2 and 3. Any waste not in compliance with Conditions 2 and 3 shall be placed in a secure storage area within the site and the Waste Disposal Authority informed immediately. The Waste Disposal Authority shall be given not

less than 24 hours notice of the proposed method of dealing with the rejected waste. The waste shall be removed from the site within 7 days of the date of receipt.

6. Any liquid waste discovered pursuant to the duties imposed by condition 5 of this licence shall be stored in a suitably designed, constructed and labelled vessel. The vessel(s) shall be maintained to ensure that they are leak proof and in good working order.

7. Suitable and sufficient reception vessels shall be provided within the site for the reception of waste batteries.

8. Within 2 months from the date of commencement of operations under this Licence, a Site Identification Board of durable material and finish shall be displayed and maintained at a suitable point near the site access showing the times when the site is open, giving the licence number and the name and telephone number of the operator and the Waste Disposal Authority.

9. (i) Subject to (ii) operating hours shall be from 07.00 hours to 18.00 hours Monday to Friday inclusive and 07.00 hours to 18.00 hours on Saturday and 07.00 hours to 18.00 hours on Sunday.

(ii) Operations shall not take place during the hours covered by official lighting up times (i.e. half an hour after sunset to half an hour before sunrise) unless adequate lighting is provided.

10. Adequate measures shall be taken to prevent the deposit of mud, oil, grease or metal fragments on the highway as a result of site operations.

11. All vessels used for storage of scrap metal waste shall be suitably labelled to describe their contents. Any inappropriate name markings and other identifications shall be obliterated.

12. All bulk storage vessels used in connection with the operation of the site shall be suitably designed and constructed and they shall be maintained to ensure that they are leak-proof and in working order whenever in use.

13. Any liquid storage tanks or drums shall be located within a bund having a capacity of not less than 110% of the largest tank or drum. If tanks are connected by pipework in such a way as to allow equalisation of the level of the contents, then the bund capacity shall be 110% of the largest combined volume. The floor and walls of the bund shall be impervious to oil and water (and resistant to any stored chemicals). Inlet/outlet/vent pipes and gauges must be within the [REDACTED] area. The disposal of contaminated water from within [REDACTED] shall be carried out in a manner agreed with the Waste Disposal Authority.

14. Any accumulation of water or other liquid within the bund surrounding a tank or other vessel shall be removed so as to retain the effectiveness of the bund and the liquid disposed of in a manner agreed with the Waste Disposal Authority.

15. Whenever waste handling operations are being carried out the site shall be adequately manned to ensure compliance with the conditions of this licence.

16. Whenever waste handling operations are being carried out the site shall be supervised by a person competent to ensure compliance with the licence conditions.

17. Complete batteries shall be stored in such a manner as to prevent spillage or leakage of acid.

18. The quantity of waste (excluding scrap metal) stored on site in containers shall not exceed 50 m³ unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Waste Disposal Authority.

19. Waste stored in containers (excluding scrap metal) shall not remain on site for longer than 1 month unless it contains food, food processing waste or any other noxious material in which case it shall be moved within four days.

20. Adequate loading shovels or other equipment capable of dealing with the quantity of waste delivered to the site in the manner specified in this licence shall be provided for transferring waste into containers. If such mobile plant breaks down either another appropriate item of plant shall be provided or the waste input to the site shall be reduced, or stopped, as appropriate, to ensure that all licence conditions are complied with.

21. Containers of waste types which could become windblown shall be netted or sheeted other than when the container is being loaded. All such containers shall be netted or sheeted by the end of the working day.

22. Any spillage shall be dealt with immediately to clear or alleviate the effect of the spillage and adequate quantities of sand/absorbent material shall be on hand.

23. Any proposals for amendment to the drainage or surfacing of the site shall be submitted for the prior approval of the Waste Disposal Authority.

24. The discovery of friable/fibrous asbestos material during the dismantling/cutting of any waste shall be notified to the Waste Disposal Authority. Such asbestos shall be placed into polythene bags minimum 500 gauge and double bagged. When filled the bags shall be sealed so as to prevent the escape of dust and be stored in a waterproof secure area. Bags shall be

removed and disposed of without delay to an appropriately licensed disposal site, in accordance with the Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980.

25. The discovery of any material which could contain PCB's during dismantling of any type of item in which PCB's have been used, shall be notified to the Waste Disposal Authority. The PCB or suspected PCB material shall be stored in a secure container. Material containing PCB's or contaminated with PCB's shall be disposed of without delay to an appropriately licensed disposal facility, in accordance with the Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980.

26. Where it is necessary for components to contain lubricating oil, they shall be stored in such a manner as to prevent spillage or leakage of oil.

27. Where any container tank/vessel is to be cut/crushed it shall be done in such a way as to prevent spillage of any contents or residue directly onto the ground, and such activities shall be carried out in the designated working area as outlined in green on the attached plan 992/1.

28. The designated area shall be adequately surfaced to prevent contamination of the underlying ground occurring

29. No waste material shall be burned within the boundaries of the site, other than within a properly constructed and approved furnace or fireplace.

30. At all times the site shall be kept in a tidy condition.

31. All necessary action shall be taken to prevent the dissemination of odour, fumes, dust or windblown material.

32. The licensed area shall be fenced and gated sufficient to prevent unauthorised access and the gate(s) shall be kept

locked at all times whilst the site is unattended. The gate(s) and fencing shall be maintained when necessary to ensure the security of the licensed area.

33. The Waste Disposal Authority shall be immediately informed of any incident that could give rise to danger to public health, pollution of water, or could be seriously detrimental to local amenity, including any fire.

34. Access shall be available at all reasonable times for inspection by the Waste Disposal Authority.

35. A record shall be kept of the types, quantities and dates of waste handled and made available to the Waste Disposal Authority on request.

36. By 30th of April each year while this licence is in force, a summary in a form approved by the Waste Disposal Authority of the types and quantities of waste handled at the site during the period from 1st April the previous year to 31st March, shall be submitted to the Waste Disposal Authority.

37. The terms of the licence shall be made known to any person who is given responsibility for the management or control of the site and a copy shall be maintained at the control office for the site.

Footnotes

(a) If asbestos, PCB's or other hazardous materials are encountered during dismantling operations the Health and Safety Executive should be contacted immediately.

(b) All reasonable enquiries should be made to ascertain the former contents of any container, tank or vessel prior to delivery to the site and any necessary action taken. Steps should also be taken to ensure that it is completely empty and ventilated.

OTHER STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS:

Licence holders should note that this licence is issued under Section 5 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 and it does not provide them with exemption from any other statutory requirements.

British Telecom plant exists in an underground track along Adelaide Street. Care must be taken to avoid damage to B.T plant. Please ring Freefone 111 giving 3 days notice of your intended works.

National Rivers Authority, Olympia House, Gelderd Road, Leeds, LS12 6DD

Vehicle dismantling operations must take place on a hard standing impervious surface. Vehicle batteries must be stored in an area with an impervious base. All oil and chemical drums (storage containers) should be stored in a compound with an impervious base with the floor graded in such a manner that the contents of the largest drum (container) are retained in the event of a spillage.

The site lies on a locally important aquifer. Care must be taken to protect groundwater supplies from potential contamination.

Yorkshire Water Services Limited, Planning Liason, Western house, Western Way, Halifax Road, Bradford BD6 2LZ

The prior formal consent of Yorkshire Water is required for the discharge to public sewer of any trade effluent (including vehicle washwater) or contaminated surface water from the proposed development.

There must be no discharge of any waste materials such as oils, solvents, slurries or chemicals to sewer. These should be collected in sealed containers and disposed of away from the site.

Surface water from vehicle parking and hardstanding areas

should be passed through adequate interceptor(s) prior to discharge to public sewer. Roof drainage should not be passed through any interceptor.

 - e). quantities in tonnes removed and waste type - as specified by the Agency
 - f). destination of materials removed by local authority district
36. A summary of the information specified in condition 35 above shall be submitted to the Agency, in a format and at a frequency as required by the Agency. This summary shall be submitted within fourteen days of the end of the accounting period specified by the Agency.

The following condition shall be added

SW1. The types of waste permitted for acceptance under the terms of this licence shall exclude any waste which is Special Waste as defined by the Special Waste Regulation 1996, other than wastes which were contained in or formed part of a motor vehicle and were necessary for the normal operation of that vehicle.

S37 NOTES

Appeals

If a licence holder is aggrieved by the decision of the Agency in modifying conditions specified in a Waste Management Licence he may appeal to the Secretary of State in accordance with Section 43 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. Appeals must be notified within 6 months of the date of this notice to The Planning Inspectorate, Room 12/03D, Tolgate House, Houlton Street, Bristol, BS2 9DJ.

The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of notice of an appeal but he will not normally be prepared to exercise this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of an appeal.

Where a notice giving the Agency's decision to modify a Waste Management Licence includes a statement that for the purpose of preventing pollution of the environment or harm to human health Section 43[4] of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 should not apply to the decision, the notification of an appeal against the decision will not of itself render the decision ineffective pending determination of the appeal.

If you consider that such a statement has been unreasonably included in the notice of decision you may apply, under Section 43(7) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 to the Secretary of State to determine whether the Agency's action was unreasonable or not, (the address to write to is as given above). If the Secretary of State determines that the Agency acted unreasonably in including such a statement, the Agency's decision will become ineffective while an appeal is pending and you will be entitled to recover compensation from the Agency in respect of any loss you have suffered in consequence of the statement. Any dispute as to your entitlement to compensation or its amount shall be determined by arbitration.
